Amulet of Horus as a falcon, Nubian
Napatan Period, reign of Harsiyotef or his successor
404-353 B.C.

At the MFA: In Ancient Egypt and Ancient Nubia, people wore amulets, objects which were meant to bring protection to whoever wore them. This Nubian amulet represented Horus, a Falcon God who was believed to protect the wearer from threatening forces.

At Home: Do you have anything that you consider your own personal amulet, or something that makes you feel safe? Maybe it stays at home, maybe you wear it, or maybe you bring it around with you where you go. For example, I wear a necklace with a lotus flower, a symbol of perseverance and inner strength.
